




Figure 2 Temporary Assistance Families 60-Month Trend through October 2004












Figure 5 Missouri Medicaid Payments Month Trend through October 2004

Figure 6 Food Stamp Households 60-Month Trend through October 2004





Figure 7 Food Stamp Benefits 60-Month Trend through October 2004
