





Figure 2 Temporary Assistance Families 60-Month Trend through May 2005








Figure 5 Missouri Medicaid Payments 30-Month Trend through May 2005

Figure 6 Food Stamp Households 60-Month Trend through May 2005





Figure 7 Food Stamp Benefits 60-Month Trend through May 2005
