


Figure 4 **Missouri Medicaid Recipients**




Figure 5 **Missouri Medicaid Payments**

Figure 6 Food Stamp Households 60-Month Trend through September 2005




Figure 7 Food Stamp Benefits 60-Month Trend through September 2005


